▪ Surveys from Start to Finish (2 days)

This workshop is for individuals who wish to learn how to develop their own surveys or evaluate proposals for surveys that they wish to conduct through other survey organizations.

This workshop reviews the survey process on a step by step basis, from planning and sample selection to carrying out the survey. The workshop also covers the processes of preparation and handling of collected data, as well as the presentation of the results and measures taken to ensure the confidentiality during the release.

▪ The Canadian System of National Economic Accounts (1 day)

This workshop provides an overview of the accounting framework of the Canadian System of National Accounts (CSNA). It covers the structure of the main accounts and shows how the integration of these accounts in the CSNA facilitates economic analysis.

This workshop is intended for those who use macro-economic statistics for analyzing the country's economic situation or as a complement in the analysis of a single aspect of the economy, or for those who teach macro-economics. It is also intended for individuals who are required to write about CSNA statistics.

▪ Using the Input-Output Model to Estimate Economic Impact (1 day)

This workshop will present the Input-Output model which is used for estimating the economic impact of policy or investment decisions. Through examples and simulations, participants will learn about the applications of the national and provincial Input-Output framework and structure, valuation and commodity balance, classifications and how to use multipliers. The Input-Output model is based on the extensive array of information used to measure the Canadian economy.

This workshop is designed for individuals who wish to gain a basic knowledge on the possibilities and the uses of the Input-Output model.

The workshop combines lectures with discussion and practical exercises.

Via its conceptual approach, this workshop targets regular users of Census results. The workshop addresses those who want to better define their information needs in terms of both data and tables for the purposes of analyses related to Census universes.
